Showing a similar tapering off, the divorce rate for married women was 21.1 per 1,000 for 1976. This was an increase of 3.9 percent over the rate for 1975 (20.3), in contrast to the



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(1968-75), annual increases in the divorce rate ranged from 4.5 to 11.5 percent. Showing a similar tapering off, the divorce



annual increases ranging from 5.2 to 11.6 percent during the preceding 8 years.

Regional divorce rates showed the usual pronounced variation in 1976. The rate was 3.2 per 1,000 population in the Northeast Region, 4.7 in the North Central, 5.7 in the South, and 6.7 in the West.

For the 29 States that participated in the divorce-registration area (DRA), the median duration of marriages ending in divorce was 6.5 years in 1976, the same as in 1975 and 1974. The median duration of marriages ending in divorce for the DRA had gradually declined to this level from a peak of 7.5 years in 1963.

According to data obtained from the DRA States on ages of divorcing spouses, the distribution of age at time of divorce, for both husbands and wives, became somewhat more peaked between 1971 and 1976. Of those divorcing in 1971 for whom age was reported, 51.3 percent of the husbands and 47.2 percent of the wives were between 25 and 39 years of age at time of decree, while in 1976 the corresponding percentages increased to 56.3 and 52.9, respectively. Between 1971 and 1976, the percentage under 25 years of age at divorce declined from 17.8 to 16.1 percent for husbands and from 29.3 to 26.5 percent for wives; there were similar declines in the percentages over 39 years of age at divorce.

The total number of children under 18 years of age involved in divorce is estimated annually for the United States, based on data reported by States in the divorce-registration area. The estimate for 1976 was 1,117,000, a decline of 0.5 percent from the 1975 estimate (1,123,000). This was the first decline in the total number of children affected by divorce since 1960.

The average number of children per divorce has been declining for many years, from a maximum of 1.36 in 1964 to 1.08 in 1975 and 1.03 in 1976. Of the couples divorced in the DRA

States during 1976, 44 percent reported no children under 18 years of age, that is, they either had no children or their children were grown. The remaining 56 percent reported one or more children, the majority being small families with one or two children. Only 11 percent reported three or more children. In 1964, when the average number of children per decree was highest, data for the reporting States showed 37 percent of the divorcing couples with no children under 18 years of age and 63 percent with one or more children; 20 percent reported three or more children.

Although couples divorcing in recent years have, on the average, fewer children than couples divorcing earlier, children of today have a greater likelihood of being affected by a divorce than children of former years. The number of children involved in divorce per 1,000 children in the total population has grown from 8.7 in 1964 to 16.9 in 1975 and 17.1 in 1976.

The statistics for the divorce-registration area presented in this report are based on sample data and consequently are subject to sampling variability. Further discussion of sampling variability appears in the Technical Notes.

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## **TECHNICAL NOTES**

## Place and Time of Occurrence

Divorces, including absolute divorces, annulments, and dissolutions of marriage, are shown in all tables by State where decree was granted, which is also the State of legal residence of the petitioner. The time of divorce is based on the date the decree was granted.

## Sources of Data

Figures in tables 1 and 2 are based on totals of divorce decrees tabulated and reported by States and counties. Figures in tables 3 and 5 are based on data tabulated from State-coded data tapes and from probability samples of divorce records selected and coded in the National Center for Health Statistics from copies of the records sent in by States participating in the divorce-registration area. For 1971-76, 29 States participated.

Figures in table 4 were estimated by using several methods. Estimates for 1954-59 were prepared on the assumption that the average number of children per decree for the Nation was identical with that for the reporting States. The figure for 1960 was based on a nationwide sample. Figures for 1961-76 were prepared by multiplying the national divorce total by the average number of children per decree found in the combined States with satisfactory reporting of the number of children. There were 16 such States in 1961-69, all 28 registration States in 1970, and 29 registration States in 1971-76.

#### **Divorce Samples**

Sample data used to estimate the 1976 frequencies in table 5 and the frequencies used to compute median duration of marriage for 1974-76 in table 3 were selected by using four different sampling rates, including 10, 20, 50, or 100 percent of the divorces granted in a State. Samples were selected only from the States that participated in the divorce-registration area. Seven States-Missouri, Nebraska, New York, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Vermont, and Virginia-supplied State-coded data tapes of all their divorce records through the Cooperative Health Statistics System, and 100 percent of these records were used by NCHS. States, sampling rates depended on the size of the annual divorce total for each State. South Dakota was the only State coded in NCHS with a 100-percent sampling rate.

Sampling errors are given in the table for the estimates which constitute 1, 10, 25, 50, 75, 90, and 99 percent of the annual divorce totals. These sampling errors are given for the divorce-registration area and each registration State for 1976 data and only for the divorce-registration area for 1974 and 1975 data.
